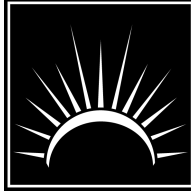

CALL TO CONFESSION

1 Peter 4:13

Therefore let those who suffer according to God's will entrust their souls to a faithful Creator while doing good.

Understanding that, apart from Christ, we cannot meet God's standard of righteousness as revealed in His word, we pray to God, confessing our sins together as a church, both sins of commission and sins of omission. We also ask God to forgive our sin because of Christ's atoning work on our behalf and to transform us into the likeness of Christ by the power of Holy Spirit.

Our reader assures us, on the authority of God's Word, that all who confess and repent of their sin and believe the gospel—that Christ died for our sins according to the scriptures, and that He was buried, and that He rose again the third day according to the scriptures—are freely pardoned by God.

Come to me, all who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me, for I am gentle and lowly in heart, and you will find rest for your souls.

“Behold, I am laying in Zion a stone,

So the honor is for you who believe, but for those who do not believe,

“The stone that the builders rejected
has become the cornerstone,” and
“A stone of stumbling,
and a rock of offense.”

They stumble because they disobey the word, as they were destined to do.

But you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a people for his own possession, that you may proclaim the excellencies of him who called you out of darkness into his marvelous light. Once you were not a people, but now you are God's people; once you had not received mercy, but now you have received mercy.

Beloved, I urge you as sojourners and exiles to abstain from the passions of the flesh, which wage war against your soul. Keep your conduct among the Gentiles honorable, so that when they speak against you as evildoers, they may see your good deeds and glorify God on the day of visitation.
